Guaje:

**A traditional water carrier
Used by a modern

GUAJE - A GOURD



On this day, March 4, 2017, Armando the artist and naturalist, carried a traditional water carrier on his nature hike. It was out of the way and his hands were free as he conveniently strapped it onto his shoulder and across his chest with rustic jute twine. He was complimented and received several questions about the guaje's origin. Not only did he make it, but he grew it! He got the seed from his

uncle, planted it, and provided a climbing structure for the vine to grow on.

When the fruit matures, it looks like a squash but is not edible. In the Americas people have edible gardens, medicinal gardens, and technology gardens. The *guaje* is from the technology garden. It fills an important role as a water carrier. When the Tarahumara, Indians from northern Mexico, travel and run their long distances, they carry a *guaje* strapped to their body. They carry only corn powder, *pinole*. On the road, when they come to a river, they take a bit of *pinole* and put it in their *guaje*, add water, and drink it as their nutritional source.

Armando harvested his guaje, and put it aside to naturally dry for about two years. Then when he shakes it, the seeds are audible as they are tossed to and fro. He cut off the top near the stem which would provide the drinking point. He poured in water with some rocks to loosen the seeds and fibers. After shaking it about 5 times, he poured the water and rocks out, and the seeds and fibers poured out with it. Then he let it dry some more. Now, it is functional as a container for his water when he goes on his nature hikes at Whittier Narrows Natural Area.

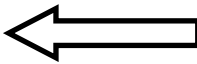
EXCITING SIGHTINGS
